HAMMERHEADS MAKE A SPLASH IN THE NEWS!



The local competitive swim team that uses the Metuchen Y for practice, the Jersey Hammerheads, has been making a splash in the news recently! The team was formed and is coached by Mike McQuay, the father of one of the swimmers, after doctors told him 15 years ago that his son would never walk or talk after receiving the diagnosis that he son had Autism Spectrum Disorder. Not only did Mike refuse to accept this

prognosis, but he did something about it. He started the team and recruited other youth with autism to participate in this competitive team. The swim team initially used the Raritan Bay YMCA facility for their lessons, but 2 1/2 years ago, Mike approached Marie Patterson to see if the team could use the Metuchen branch for their lessons. Of course, Marie welcomed them with open arms and since that time, Marie and Danica Lindsey, Aquatics Director, have been privileged to watch them make remarkable progress. Not surprisingly, Michael has defied all of the odds and now has an impressive collection of gold, silver and bronze medals from various local and state Special Olympic competitions.

The team caught the attention of independent producer and director Lara Stolman who made a documentary called "Swim Team" which "chronicles the daily struggles and triumphs that families such as the McQuays have experienced while seeking a sense of inclusion despite differences." The film has already won several awards around the country and will be released in movie theaters in the United States within the next month. It has also been recently acquired by PBS' non-fiction showcase "Point of View" and will make its national television debut in October. Our local newspaper, the Home News Tribute, also published an article about the team that you can find <u>here</u> and the Today Show has expressed an interest in doing a segment for their show and will be visiting the Metuchen Y in October to film!

While all of the media attention is exciting, the main objective still remains clear that children diagnosed with autism face challenges and obstacles everyday, and it is the Y's commitment to help them overcome the odds by providing the means necessary to help them succeed.
