RMP SCHOLARSHIP AWARD WINNER ANNOUNCED

The winner of this year Ryan Patterson Memorial Scholarship has been announced! This year's winner is Shreya Shivakumar, a student from John P. Stevens High School in Edison, who, despite the fierce competition, rose head and shoulders among her peers. We believe, once your hear Shreya's story, that you will agree.

Shreya has a diverse and impressive resume, despite her young age. Her high school accomplishments include receiving the AP Scholar with Distinction medal, earning the NJ Seal of Bi-literacy in Spanish and English, and being named a National Merit finalist. She is also the president of her school's Spanish Honor Society and is part of their mock trial team.



Shreya and her family are first-generation Indian immigrants, and struggled with food insecurity for years. Years later, while volunteering at a local food pantry, she discovered that many underprivileged people with food allergies had no access or could not afford allergy-safe foods. To address this issue, Shreya took it upon herself to found <u>Nourish America</u>, a charitable organization that provides allergy-friendly food to people in need. She has hosted several allergy-friendly food drives to donate over 2,800 lbs. of food to communities across the tristate area and has hosted fundraisers which raised \$7,000 to alleviate hunger in her community. Earlier this year, Nourish America began a partnership with Food Allergy Research & Education (FARE), the world's largest nonprofit organization dedicated to food allergies. She joined the FARE Teen Advisory Group and became an anti-hunger and food allergy advocate. She attended the virtual FARE Living Teal Global Summit in October and received the inaugural Living Teal Spotlight Award for combating hunger within the food allergy community. As a Girl Scout Ambassador, Shreya is educating local girl scout troops about food allergy safety and has hosted food allergy education webinars for 430 children in 16 U.S. states. She has also volunteered with the Refugee Assistance Partners (RAP) as an English, Math and Science tutor to refugee children, eventually working with the organization to provide food to hundreds of refugees affected by the pandemic.

In her spare time, Shreya enjoys playing pop songs on her violin, going to the gym or reading a mystery novel.

We feel that Shreya portrays all of the ideals and standards deserving of this scholarship and we congratulate her on her impressive and noteworthy accomplishments!

BRUCE PERGALLO RETIRES

TCNJ PROVIDES FREE TUTORING FOR CAMPERS

To address COVID-19 related learning loss, the College of New Jersey partnered with the NJ Pandemic Relief Fund and the Overdeck Family Foundation to launch the "Summer Tutoring Corps". The program provided tutoring this summer for campers in grades K–5 who have experienced pandemicrelated learning loss. The tutors provided eight weeks of mathematics instruction for the Y's campers for about 45 minutes a day on Monday, Wednesday and Thursdays. The program was built into the camp day. Each camper received a workbook and worksheets while they were at camp. There is no cost to the program.
