#### **HARRIET TUBMAN CONTEST WINNER!**

G

abriella S. winner of the YMCA's Harriet Tubman contest, proudly displays her Barnes and Noble gift card which she received for receiving the most "likes" on her essay about Harriet Tubman.

The YMCA, to celebrate Black History Month and to highlight the achievements and contributions of individuals from diverse backgrounds, sponsored a contest on Harriet Tubman, a civil rights activist and abolitionist during the Civil War. Students enrolled in the YMCA School Aged Child Care Programs were eligible to participate in the contest, crafting a meaningful social media post about the life and legacy of Harriet Tubman. With the assistance and supervision of YMCA staff, the student's posts appeared on YMCA social media, ready to be "liked" or "shared". Gabriella's post received the most likes, winning her the B&N gift card!



The students not only learned the dramatic influence Harriet Tubman had on American history, but also learned how to use social media responsibly to share ideas, opinions and information. This was Gabriella's winning post:

"As a member of the human race no one has done something as extraordinary as Harriet Tubman. Originally named Araminta Harriet Ross, she was born in Dorchester County, Maryland. Harriet Tubman was born a slave and escaped slavery in 1849 using the Underground Railroad to get to Pennsylvania, a slavery-free-state. She became a conductor in the Underground Railroad helping more than 300 slaves escape. Harriet helped during the Civil War by taking care of injured soldiers, being a spy for the north and helped the military rescue over 750 slaves. Her nicknames were Minty, Moses, and General Tubman. She died on March 10, 1913 in Auburn, New York. She was a brave woman never to be forgotten."

#### **Five Days of Action**

The Week of the Young Child™ is an annual celebration hosted by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) celebrating early learning, young children, their teachers and families. 

#### **BLOOD DRIVE**

Togetherhood's second Blood Drive was another great success! A total of 19 individuals—including 15 Togetherhood volunteers and 4 YMCA staff—organized the drive on Sunday, April 23rd, along with New Jersey Blood Services (NJBS) staff. There were a total of 44 pints of blood donated for



recipients who need the red cells, white cells, or plasma! Paul Edgcomb noted that another important number—and potentially a significant one—is that there were 22 new donors. Combined with the 26 donors from the first blood drive on February 12th, this totals 48 potential new donors that were recruited for future



blood drives for NJBS. Paul notes that this number is very important,

since only 2% of our locally eligible population donates blood each year. If only 1% more people became regular blood donors, blood shortages could disappear!!  $\Lambda$ 

NJBS also held a promotion for this drive raffling off an MLB Jersey with the choice of the winner's team on the back. The winner was Metuchen Branch member Jim Howard! Congratulations to Jim and to all of the YMCA staff and volunteers who spent many hours organizing, recruiting donors, setting up and working at the donor recruiting tables, and providing support to NJBS staff on the day of drive. Well done!



#### HIDDEN HEROES MEMBERSHIP DISCOUNT

The YMCA will be offering a 25% membership discount for caregivers of veterans and service members. This benefit is being offered in conjunction with the Elizabeth Dole Foundation's Hidden Heroes Campaign, a national initiative to raise awareness and support for the 5.5 million spouses, parents, siblings, and other loved ones caring for our nation's wounded, ill or injured service members and veterans at home. In 2012, Senator Elizabeth Dole created the Foundation after witnessing firsthand the complex challenges military caregivers face while her husband, Bob, was hospitalized at Walter Reed Army Medical Center.



The Township of Edison initially joined the cause, declaring the township by way of a council resolution a "Hidden Heroes City", with the goal of raising public awareness and inspiring people, businesses and civic groups to join in the support of these caregivers. Edison is the first township in Middlesex County and the second in New Jersey to do so. This membership discount started at the Edison YMCA but is also being expanded to the Metuchen and South Amboy YMCA's as well.
