The theme was once again "Calling All Superheroes" to pay tribute to all those who have fought this beast like true heroes. Many participants came out in full garb, including the kids who had the option of wearing capes or t-shirts.




Congratulations to the Murphy family for winning a free Y membership for one year!



YMCA RECEIVES Y-USA GRANT

The YMCA of MEWSA has been chosen to participate in the launching of a Y-USA pilot program, Character Development Learning Institute (CDLI). A grant in the amount of \$15,000 was awarded to support this self-directed experience to help initiate and enhance character development among teens during out-of-school time. The program will teach teens through a variety of lessons and activities how to make good decisions and choices and how to get along with others. The participants will come from the Teen Leader's Club.

Cindy O'Neill leads the cohort with staff team members Eric Meshirer for Edison, Gabby St. Fleur for Metuchen and Joe Cohen for South Amboy to oversee program implementation. The CDL Team meets once a month and is self-guided to accomplish specified tasks. The grant will support various activities set out by the Leader's Club which then culminates in an end of school year retreat to YMCA of the Pines in Medford, NJ.
